For **industry partners**, the website introduces our work and opens the door to conversations about supporting career exploration, sharing expertise, and helping develop the next generation of skilled professionals.

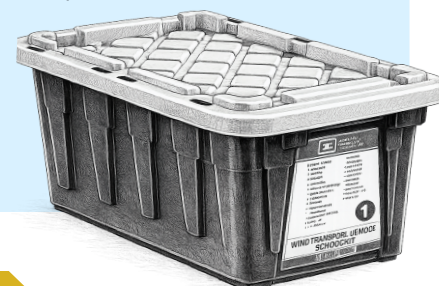
As SACI grows, our website will help keep our community connected to new opportunities. We invite you to explore, share it with others, and discover where a connection with SACI could lead.

Sign-up is now open for **Wind-Powered Transport Kits** for the 2026/27 school year! Each kit includes materials for **30 students**, along with teaching resources to support approximately **14–18 hours of class time** as students design, build, test, and refine their creations.

Participating schools are expected to send their winning team and design to the **3rd Annual Wind Rally in May 2027**, where students will represent their school and put their engineering skills to the test.

Explore New Skills. Discover Future

E3 workshops for the 2026/27 school year are here! With expanded offerings in our new facility, junior high students can explore **Agriculture**, **Health Care**, and **Trades** through hands-on experiences that connect classroom learning with future careers.

AGRICULTURE

Discover how agriculture connects science, growing systems, and food production to everyday life. Through hands-on learning and real-world experiences, students build practical skills, explore responsible resource management, and discover careers across the industry.

WORKSHOPS

Farm to Table

Our Farm to Table field trip gives students a firsthand look at how agricultural products become the foods we eat. Through real-world observations, students explore connections between farming, food processing, and everyday life while building their understanding of food production, asking questions, and discovering careers across agriculture and the food industry.

Growing Systems

Our Growing Systems workshops help students build practical skills in caring for plants, observing growth, and understanding how growing conditions influence healthy development. Through hands-on exploration, students discover how living systems grow and reproduce while developing observation, problem-solving skills, and confidence in working with growing systems.

AgriScience

Our AgriScience workshops help students build practical skills in testing, observing, and interpreting results to understand what supports healthy crops and ecosystems. Through hands-on investigations, students may explore how science informs agricultural decisions while developing problem-solving skills or an understanding of responsible soil and water management.

Agriculture in Action

Our Agriculture in Action experiences help students understand how agricultural businesses operate and how people, technology, and services bring products to market. Through connections with industry and real-world examples, students build communication, critical-thinking, and decision-making skills while exploring the diverse careers that support agriculture.



HEALTH CARE

Explore health care through hands-on activities in lab science, patient care, wellness, and emergency response. Students build practical skills, empathy, and confidence while discovering how health-care professionals investigate, care, and respond.

WORKSHOPS

Lab Sciences

Our Lab Sciences workshops help students build practical skills in using laboratory equipment safely, making careful observations, and interpreting scientific evidence. Through hands-on investigations, students explore how living organisms and body systems function while developing curiosity, precision, and confidence in scientific inquiry.

Patient Care & Wellness

Our Patient Care & Wellness workshops help students build practical skills in observing health indicators, supporting safe movement, and practising infection prevention. Through hands-on activities, students explore how care can support comfort, dignity, and independence while developing empathy, communication skills, and awareness of accessibility needs.

Emergency Response

Our Emergency Response workshops introduce students to practical skills in assessing situations, communicating clearly, and responding safely when someone needs help. Through hands-on practice and guided scenarios, students explore how emergency care teams support patients while developing teamwork, problem-solving skills, and confidence in staying calm under pressure.



TRADES

Build practical skills and confidence through hands-on exploration of mechanical, electrical, construction, and plumbing trades. Students learn to use tools safely, solve problems, and understand how everyday systems are built and maintained.

WORKSHOPS

Mechanical Systems

Our Mechanical Systems Trades workshops help students build practical skills in using tools safely, inspecting and maintaining equipment, and troubleshooting mechanical problems. Through hands-on exploration and building activities, students discover how force, motion, and energy make systems work while developing teamwork, problem-solving skills, and confidence in their abilities.

Electrical Trades

Our Electrical Trades workshops help students build practical skills in working safely with electrical tools and materials, making secure connections, and assembling simple circuits. Through hands-on activities, students explore how electricity is controlled and distributed while developing precision, problem-solving skills, and confidence in their abilities.

Construction & Plumbing

Our Construction & Plumbing workshops help students build practical skills in measuring, assembling, and connecting building components while using tools and materials safely. Through hands-on activities and demonstrations, students explore how structures support loads or how piping systems serve while developing teamwork, and confidence in their abilities.

4 CTS Pathways. Practical Skills. New Possibilities



From responding to medical emergencies to turning a digital design into a finished product, SACI's four CTS pathway courses give students opportunities to explore their interests through practical experience. This year, we are excited to introduce Medical First Responder, adding a new direction for students interested in health care and emergency response.

Available to eligible students from our partner divisions, these courses combine flexible online learning

NEW: Medical First Responder



Students learn patient assessment, trauma and medical emergency response, scene management, and communication, with recognized certifications built into the course. This full-year pathway runs for 34 weeks, includes weekly on-campus labs, and awards 5 CTS credits.

Health Career Prep

Explore health care, community support, and therapeutic recreation while practising vital signs, personal care, safety, First Aid, CPR, AED use, and inclusive support. Offered in winter, this 12-week course includes nine full-day on-campus labs and awards 5 CTS credits.

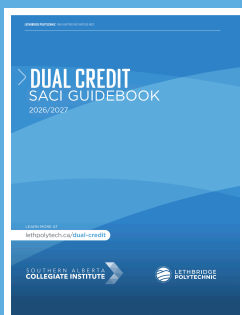
Applied CAD & 3D

Bring ideas to life by moving from technical sketches and digital models to physical products. Students use computer-aided design, 3D printing, and laser cutting or etching to develop practical design skills. This winter course runs for 12 weeks, includes nine full-day on-campus labs, and awards 4 CTS credits.

Greenhouse Green Certificate

Develop skills in plant growth, controlled-environment agriculture, crop management, irrigation, pest control, safety, and sustainability. This full-year pathway includes on-campus labs and awards 16 CTS credits.

CTS pathways award high school CTS credits only, with no Lethbridge Polytechnic credit, and have a separate collegiate registration process.

Careers in Care is an interactive health career discovery day where students explore a wide range of health-care professions through hands-on activities, demonstrations, and conversations with professionals working in the field. Students rotate through career zones to learn about educational pathways, workplace experiences, and the many opportunities available within the health-care sector. **(October 21)**



Girls Who Build is a hands-on career exploration event designed to introduce girls in Grades 7-9 to the exciting world of skilled trades through interactive workshops led by industry professionals and educators. Participants will build confidence, develop practical skills, and discover rewarding career pathways in fields such as carpentry, electrical, automotive, and other skilled trades. **(January 12)**



Harvesting Ambitions is a hands-on career exploration event that introduces students in Grades 7-9 to the diverse world of agriculture through engaging activities, demonstrations, and industry-led learning experiences. Participants will explore modern farming, food production, agricultural technology, environmental stewardship, and the many career pathways that help feed and sustain our communities. **(February 9)**



Land Provides is an immersive, hands-on learning experience that explores how Indigenous peoples of southern Alberta have traditionally used the land for food, health, shelter, tools, and everyday living. Through interactive activities connected to agriculture, health care, and trades, students discover how traditional knowledge and innovation continue to influence modern careers, technologies, and sustainable practices today. **(June 2)**

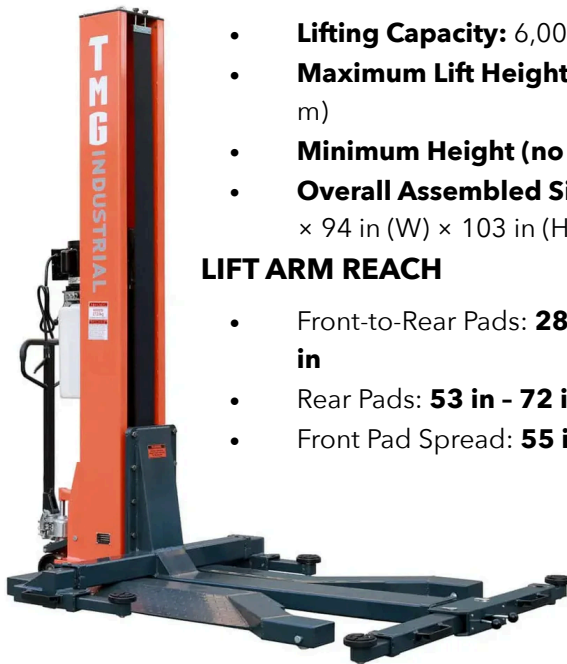
